

Now that we know we are staying in our building, the council has committed to beginning a process of renewal. They are working over the summer vacation to ensure we are moving forward. Over the next few months, you will begin to hear about the steps we are taking to set Zion up for an exciting future.

At the center of this process is a mission driven focus. The first

step is connecting what we do in worship with our daily lives by asking how faith impacts our work and challenges. We will do this through member interviews in worship, in sermons, and teaching. This has already started.

I am reminded of a writing by C. S. Lewis, "The Four Loves"

To love is to be vulnerable. Love anything, and your heart will certainly be wrung and possibly broken. If you want to make sure of keeping it intact, you must give your heart to no one, not even an animal. Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; Avoid all entanglements, lock it up safe in the casket of your selfishness. But in that casket – safe, dark, motionless, airless – it will change. It will not be broken; It will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable.

I pray we are willing to have our hearts broken, to love fully, and show our community that God is alive and working through us. Blow Holy Spirit, blow!!





I had the privilege of being one of Zion's voting representatives during the Synod Assembly on June 14-15 2024, at Susquehanna University. I went to a workshop entitled "Ministry in Divided Times....Returning, Again to Baptism" by Rev. Scott Kershner, Chaplain, Susquehanna University. He explained that the religious land-scape is changing just as fast as the earth/world landscape is changing. He expressed that the excitement at Baptism, either young or adult, needs to be rekindled in all of us if we are to work through the challenging times. He ended with this scripture reading: Ephesians 4: 11-15. "We must stop acting like children. We must not let deceitful people trick us by their false teachings, which are like the wind..... Love should always tell the truth. Then we will grow in every way and be more like Christ, the head of the body. Christ holds us together and makes all its parts work perfectly, as it grows and becomes strong because of love." He finished with a branch of a bush and sprinkled water over us.. 
